



## Who Is an LWPOA ‘Member’

You are a **Member** of Lake Wynonah Property Owner’s Association if you own property in Lake Wynonah, your name is on the recorded Deed at the Schuylkill County Courthouse, and you paid the \$500 Membership Fee. Your Membership ends when you sell all Lake Wynonah property.

A Member is in **Good Standing** if all accounts are current and may:

- Use amenities and facilities; rent Lodge and pavilion
- Use Gate Key program and access card
- If over the age of 21, purchase alcohol at the Lodge
- Purchase boat launch and vehicle stickers
- Become a member of Board-chartered committees
- Attend Board meetings; run for election to the Board
- Vote in annual election of Board of Directors and changes to By-laws

Married persons who own property in Lake Wynonah are Members, provided both spouses’ names appear on the Deed. Married couples pay only one \$500 Membership Fee. If a sole, unmarried, property-owning Member later marries, and if the new spouse is *not* added to the recoded property Deed, then new spouse is a *Resident, not a Member*. Only when the spouse is added to the Deed *and* the Business Office is provided with the Marriage Certificate does the spouse become a Member (without the need to pay another \$500 Membership Fee).

If two or more *non-married* persons’ names appear on the Deed and they are co-owners, there are two choices:

- Each co-owner pays full Membership Fee and *each* becomes a Member
- One co-owner is designated primary owner, pays full Membership Fee and becomes a Member. The co-owner(s) is considered a Resident (if s/he shows proof of living at the property) or a Permanent Guest.

A Member who owns more than one dwelling, pays the full Annual Dues on *each* dwelling and receives one vote for *each* full Annual Dues paid. A Member who owns only one vacant lot also pays the full Annual Dues on the lot and receives one vote, the same as an owner of a single dwelling. However, unlike the owner of multiple dwellings, the owner of ‘additional’ lots (vacant lots in addition to another property dwelling or lot) pays the additional lot dues of \$60 for each additional lot, but receives no additional votes for these additional lots.

For Board of Directors election and for voting to change By-laws, there is **one vote per each full Annual Dues paid, whether the Dues are for a dwelling or for a single vacant lot.**

A **Resident** :

- Lives with a Member and is not listed on the deed. This could be a spouse, family member or anyone else who lives with Member. Does not pay dues or fees.
- Must go to Business Office with Member with proof of residency to obtain Gate Pass.
- May use facilities and amenities; if over 21 may apply for \$5 Lodge Social Membership to purchase alcohol
- May **not** purchase boat or vehicle stickers, become a member of a Board chartered committee, attend Board meetings, run for the Board or vote in any election or By-law change

## Board of Directors Message

About 30 Members attended the *Communications Open Board Meeting* on November 17 to try out a Saturday morning slot. Only two came who preferred Saturday morning. The Board also holds monthly Workshop meetings. View meeting minutes on *Connect*. The January 19 Open Board meeting will focus on *Budget*. Our fiscal year begins April 1.

PA Fish & Boat and Lake Wynonah prohibit **Wake Surfing** within 200' of practically anything, including other boats and shorelines. Because of our Lake configuration, this rules out ALL wake surfing because it can be destructive to bulkheads, docks and other boats. The Board will evaluate changes made to C Dock and Sarsi Cove and some recommendations made by Members to improve access and safety.

**Delinquencies and Collections:** Significant effort goes into managing delinquent accounts. About 7% of accounts are in arrears. Major progress has been made pursuing accounts where there are assets, and reducing the number of uncollectable accounts.

### Financial Report

In 2017, Members approved an annual inflationary dues adjustment based on Social Security's Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) and capped at 3%. COLA's 2.8% 2018 adjustment will be applied to LWPOA dues on April 1, 2019. October gross income was \$174,062; budgeted income was \$168,174; variance was \$5,888 (higher revenue for grass cutting, fines, legal). Expenses were \$110,317; budgeted expenses were \$95,295; variance was \$15,022 (higher spending for supplies, Security, snow removal). Maintenance labor was favorable; heating was delivered/paid in October budgeted for November. Payroll was favorable by \$1,200. Administrative costs were up due to Security vehicle, licenses, computer service. Professional fees were up due to legal fees. Dam Reserve and Repair/Replacement were favorable to budget. Net income was \$2,275; budgeted was \$6,859; variance was \$9,134. Year-to-date net income is \$43,798; budgeted is \$4,803; variance is \$38,995.

**Access Control** We are reviewing options for replacing gate card readers and years-old software that is obsolete and no longer supported. New programs can utilize our existing cards and be programmed to prevent things like tailgating and multi-car swiping for entry.

**Membership Handbook Changes** An attorney who specializes in Home Owner Association law is reviewing our process for Fines and Appeals (sections 21-22) because of recently enacted PA law.

**Construction Authorization Permit** The Board will adopt posted changes and revise the Membership Handbook. Since January 16, permits have been issued for new septic systems (10 % of all holding tanks in the community); 7 permits have been issued for new homes.

**Plum Creek Municipal Authority** Board Members attend monthly PCMA board meetings to monitor their progress and plans.

**The Big Dam** We have collected 4 years of electronic data. This is supplied to the DEP in our yearly dam report. We are instructed to keep collecting data and if anything changes let them know. The longer we wait the more our Dam Fund grows.

### Get Bulkhead Application in Business Office

Applicants must have pre-approved Pennsylvania Department of Environmental protection permit to submit.

### Fee Permits & No Fee Permits

Permits are required for all home/property work. Proper documentation must be handed in to the Business Office. So if you do not have this in place, your contractor may be turned away.

### Winter Driving Tips

**Monitor Weather** Travel during good weather. Observe weather/traffic reports to avoid stormy roadways.

**Slow Down** Caution makes a difference on slick roads. Slowing down 5 mph or more helps limit collision damage. Keep extra car lengths between vehicles to provide more time for sudden stops.

**Know Your Extras** Learn how to use your high-tech vehicle. Taping brakes controls skid in traditional braking; pumping ABS can be dangerous. Anti-lock brakes and high-tech features are no substitute for safe driving speed and stopping distances.

**Condition Vehicle for Snow** Properly inflate tires and clear windshields. Remove snow buildup to prevent visibility issues.

### Early Dismissal/Weather Delays for Schools

There are different bus schedules during inclement weather. Pick-up/drop-off locations for BOTH SCHOOLS are the Lodge parking lot. Use CAUTION and SLOW DOWN in these areas.

### Members Buying New Property

Bring closing documents to the Business Office. Capital Contribution and first two (2) months dues are due at settlement. These need to be forwarded to the Business Office.

### Gate Key Information for Security

Members are allowed a maximum of **six (6) people** on their **Permanent Guest List**. License plates MUST be listed for all vehicles on Gate Key Form. To make changes, Gate Key Form can be picked up in the Office during normal business hours.

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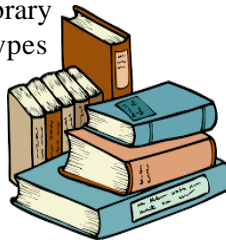

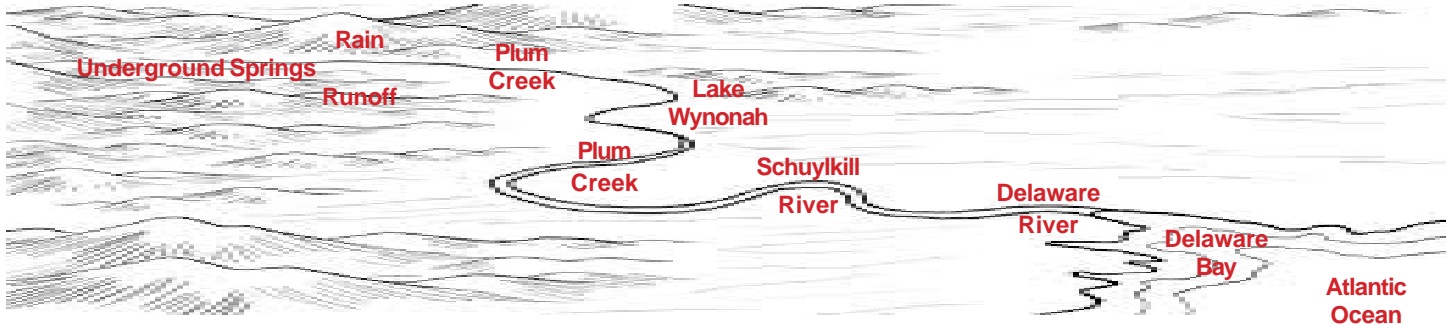

### LWPOA “Member” (cont’d from p2)

LWPOA allows Members to lease or rent a dwelling and provides for *Tenant Membership*. Rules prohibit renting or leasing a room, part of a dwelling or a vacant lot. Rentals must be a minimum six months. Members must notify the Business Office in advance and complete required documents. Member is responsible for Tenant actions. A Tenant Member is a person who has:

- Entered into a written lease agreement for a term of at least six months with a Member in Good Standing
- Submitted *Application for Tenant Status* to Bus. Office
- Paid annual *Tenant Membership Fee* (50% of Annual Dues)
- Enjoys same rights as a Resident to use amenities and facilities, to obtain a gate access card, and to apply for Lodge Social Membership

A Member must pre-authorize community entry of **Guests** (including delivery persons/vendors). Members in good standing who own a home may designate up to six (6) persons as Permanent Guests by submitting their names in writing to Security. Permanent Guests are authorized to purchase a Gate Access Card (\$45/year) at the Business Office. Permanent Guests may use the pool area without being accompanied by the Member but must present appropriate ID.

Members may pre-authorize entry for other Guests using the Gate Key program at [gatekey.us/LOGIN](http://gatekey.us/LOGIN) or by calling Security in advance of visit. When more than five (5) Guests are expected, Member must provide Security with a *Party List Form*.

Members must accompany Guests using the pool, Lodge, lakes or other amenities. Members are responsible for actions of their Guests. In the event a Guest incurs a Violation, the Violation Notice will be sent to the Member and the Member is responsible for payment of any resulting fine.

## Winter Safety Is Common Sense

No matter how well the snow and ice are removed from sidewalks, parking lots and the surrounding streets, people invariably encounter slippery surfaces in winter. Plan ahead and use caution.

- Dress warmly and wear boots with non-skid soles (avoid plastic and leather soles). Cleats are easy to attach and can be a lifesaver. Keep pairs in your car and home. On icy surfaces, "walk like a penguin" with feet pointed out; heels first. Heels ... toes. Heels ... toes.
- Keep warm, but make sure you hear what's going on around you. Wear a bright scarf or hat or reflective gear so drivers can see you. Make sure clothing doesn't block your vision or make it hard for you to hear traffic.
- A heavy backpack or other load will challenge balance. Don't carry too much. Keep your hands and arms free for better balance. Do carry a flashlight at night.
- During the day, wear sunglasses to see better and avoid glare hazards. At night, wear bright clothing or reflective gear. Dark clothing makes it difficult for motorists to see you, especially if they aren't expecting pedestrians.
- When entering a building, remove snow and water from your boots. Floors and stairs may be wet and slippery. Walk carefully.
- Use special care when entering and exiting vehicles. Use the vehicle for support.

Streets and sidewalks cleared of snow and ice should still be approached with caution. Look out for "black ice." Dew, fog or water vapor can freeze on cold surfaces and form an extra-thin, nearly invisible layer of ice that looks like a wet spot. It often shows up early morning or in shaded areas.

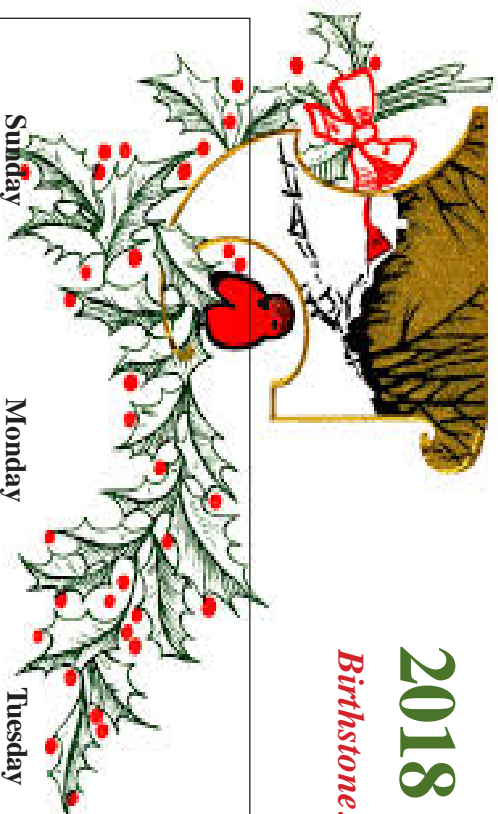

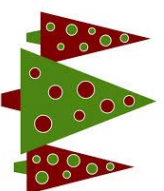


