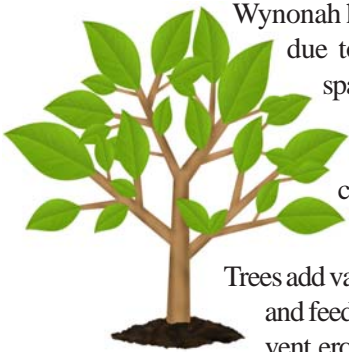


For Our Lake's Sake: *Plant a Tree!*



Wynonah has lost hundreds of trees, primarily due to the Emerald Ash Borer. Public spaces and private properties are having sad, chain saw encounters. Our Lakes Committee's *Plant a Tree* challenge to Members can greatly help remedy our tree loss. *Please join us!*

Trees add value and health to our properties, lakes and feeder streams. Roots hold nutrients, prevent erosion, and are vanguard filters for pollutants, sewage, road spills, animal waste, and landscape chemicals. Trees reduce erosive water runoff. Their canopy provides shade, shelters animals, and decomposes to enrich soil. Trees are vital to the earth and our lake community's wellbeing.

During March/April, the Lakes Committee seeks donations to buy plants for public areas fringing our lakes where trees have been cut down. Seedlings can be purchased for as little as \$1 from our County's *Seedling Sale* (porcupinepat@yahoo.com). Mature trees cost considerably more. Areas will be evaluated by Maintenance for replanting. Your donation will help restore the beauty and healthy environmental impact of trees around our lakes. Our goal: **600 Trees!** Plant on your property or donate to help Wynonah replant lost trees.

Feeding Deer Does More Harm than Good

Feeding deer may enhance wildlife viewing and increase photo/video opportunities, but supplemental feeding leads to increased disease, long-term habitat destruction, increased vehicle collisions, habituation to humans, and alteration of behavioral patterns. Feeding by humans increases potential for disease (Chronic Waste Disease, tuberculosis, mange) transmission. Invasion of exotic plants via feed can have serious consequences. Feeding serves to concentrate deer in small areas, causes damage to native forage species, and makes deer increasingly dependent upon supplements.

Winter mortality is nature's way of ensuring the strongest survive to reproduce. It will never be eliminated. Survival is determined by availability of high-quality fall food (to ensure fat accumulation) and winter thermal cover (to conserve energy). By late fall and through winter, deer instinctively reduce food intake. The herd will be more fit if not dependent on humans for food. So, please don't feed our deer.

Board of Directors Report

On February 19, the Plum Creek Municipal Authority Board (Jim Ridderhoff, Jerry Weiss, Matt Gruber, Corby Lewis) voted 4-0 to adopt Option C outlined in its Sewage Facilities Alternative Analysis, published on PCMA website www.plumcreekma.info. Option C reads: "Discontinue the PCMA's use of its trucks for pumping and hauling, remove the PCMA's sewage treatment plant from service, and require each property owner to contract with a private hauling company to pump out tanks. The wastewater would be conveyed to the treatment plant(s) with which the private hauling company has a disposal agreement." Wynonah Board Directors Purcell, Haggerty and Larsen attended and voiced concerns about this decision. Our official response is being developed and will be shared with Members. Previous Board correspondence to PCMA and others on this matter is posted on *Connect*.

Thank you Morag Donlevy for your Board Service. Morag resigned but will continue to serve on the Lodge Committee. Joe Haggerty will assume Treasurer position until August election.

The newly created Lodge Committee's Board Resolution and Charter are posted on *Connect*. Members Deb Brewer, Marge McLain, Morag Donlevy, John Verno and Keith Frederick, assisted by Board liaisons Ron Larsen and Frank Miller, will run Lodge operations. Come for dinner or a drink. Meet neighbors and make friends!

Minutes of the February 18 Board Workshop Meeting, attended by all Directors either in person or by phone, are posted on *Connect*. Motions that were passed:

Membership Handbook Section 12, *Watercraft Operations*, provides more precise definitions of allowed watercraft; clarifies PA boat regulations that are enforced by our Security patrol; and reiterates policies (i.e. invasive species) and prohibitions (i.e. wake surfing) that protect lakes, shorelines and lake users.

Changes to Membership Handbook Section 22/23, *Violations and Appeals*, provide for Members to request a meeting with the Community Manager and Security before a *Notice of Fine* is issued; more clearly defines the *Violation, Fine and Hearing/Appeal* process; and provides Member an opportunity to participate in an *Alternate Dispute Resolution*.

Approved purchase of handheld radio communication equipment and rental of radio repeater services from Green Communications to provide Security and Management with dedicated, reliable communication equipment, which can be used anywhere in the community such as between roving patrols, main entrance and lake/shore patrols.

Garland Communications will install electric service, video cameras and recorders for surveillance of Sarsi Cove and B Dock. This covers the new swim area, Fawn Lake Dam/Breast and will provide greater security.

We continually monitor our dam as we await further DEP directives.

The dam outlet valve was closed February 1. Lake level has risen about 1.5 feet. It will rise a total of 5 feet with Winter thaw and Spring rains. Lake ice 99% disappeared on Monday, February 25 with the help of 26 mph winds and a bright sun. It won't be long before boats make their appearance and our 2019 lake season begins.

Relocate existing boat docks at C Dock making C Dock 'swimming only'. Size, location and configuration of swim platform(s) to be determined. C Dock swim area will be larger and safer and eliminate conflict between boaters and swimmers.

Treasurer's Report

January Operating Income of \$71,700 was higher than the budget of \$71,400. Revenues were \$10,300 higher than budget mainly due to higher legal collections billings. Operating expenses were \$10,000 over budget due to increased expenses for Lodge *deep cleaning*, maintenance/administration fuel expenses, both dams annual dam inspections, and higher legal collection expenses. Spending was favorable to budget for snow removal material (seasonally, we are over budget) and payroll. Year-to-date through January 31, income is ahead of budget by \$32,100 due to \$4,400 favorable spending and revenue \$27,700 ahead of budget. As of January 3, total Reserves (Capital/Repair & Replace/Dam Fund) were \$4,032,000 and total Balance Sheet Cash was \$3,736,000. Fiscal year 2019 begins April 1, 2019. The FY19 budget was presented to Members at the January 19 Open Board Meeting. Highlights include revenues of \$2,134,000 and expenses of \$1,306,000. Capital and Repair/Replacement outlays are budgeted at \$390,000. Major planned expenditures are roads, pool repairs, Lodge improvements, Security expenditures, Maintenance vehicle/machinery repairs, Sarsi and C Dock access improvements, and Security boat replacement. Budget details are available in the Business Office for Member review and comment. The Board will vote to approve a final budget at the March 23 Open Board Meeting. We are working with the Office to update the Membership Handbook for posting on *Connect*.

Come to the Open Board Meeting on Saturday, March 23, 10 am in the Business Office *Gathering Room*. We will formally adopt Operating and Capital Budgets for fiscal year beginning April 1, 2019. Comments on the draft budgets can be sent to the Business Office.
