Lake Wynonah COVID-19 Yellow Phase Re-opening Plan

The Lake Wynonah Board of Directors continues to monitor plans developed by the Governor to re-open the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Schuylkill County is set to move into the Yellow Phase on May 29, 2020. Lake Wynonah will officially move to the Yellow Phase beginning at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, May 29, 2020.

The Chart below identifies the Lake Wynonah amenities that will re-open along with Lake Wynonah POA guidelines for all Members, Residents and Guests during the Yellow re-opening phase.

PLEASE NOTE: The Lodge Restaurant and Pub remains closed during the Yellow Phase of re-opening. Current Business Office restrictions remain in place.

The goal of the Lake Wynonah Board of Directors is to open as many of our amenities as possible, in a time frame that allows the POA to fully implement the guidelines developed by the Governor and the CDC to best protect our beautiful Community allowing members to enjoy this summer season.

Our goal for opening our pool will be a phased approach beginning Wednesday, June 4, 2020. To be compliant with both the Commonwealth and CDC guidelines, the POA needs to implement many changes.
